






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Concept Diagram -The concept for the revitalization of the neighborhood started by prioritizing community and walkability, designating three neighborhood centers, providing walkable nodes for community activity with greenways and a park network to stitch the area together and bringing in the city's transit system to provide essential access.



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

Alabama Chapter of the American Planning Association Proposed Peacock Place Zoning




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Phase I: Core Infill




