- Acceptance of new position risky
 - Demonstrated value of staff Planner

 - Lean on own knowledge/experience

 - When things go wrong = "guess who's to blame?"
- Educated Mountain Brook Citizenry keeps her on her toes
 - Mountain Brook 8th in nation % adults with college degree (81%)
 - All councilpersons have legal backgrounds and/or are practicing attorneys
 - Must "know her stuff" and be ready for "cross-examination" from board members and public



Staff/Board Level:

- Built Planning Department from ground up
 - Won favor and cooperation (staff and board level) when met with initial resistance to "change"
 - Disarmed those who felt threatened by potential diminished power
 - Developed new planning processes and procedures
 - Educated council/board members on sound planning practices
 - Improved decision-making process

 - Economic Development Committee
 - Village Beautification Committee

- Streamlined planning process : made more user-friendly

- Controversial Lane Parke PUD largest development proposed in Mountain Brook's history:
