- Moved back to Alabama in 2000 to be the Director of Planning for the City of Gadsden.
- While in Gadsden, he directed the completion of several major public works projects such as Gadsden's Airport Industrial Park.
- Also implemented a number of important planning projects including the East Broad Street Trolley Plazas, the Gadsden Riverfront Revitalization projects, and the Coosa Town Center retail development.
