






VISION MAP







The Treasure On The Tallapoosa

Nestled at the borders of Elmore and Tallapoosa Counties is Tallassee, AL - a city populated by approximately 5,000 diverse, hardworking citizens.

It is home to a bustling industrial park, reputable public schools and workforce development programs, and an array of other human, institutional, natural, and historical assets.





How the Plan began...



- In May 2017, Alabama Communities of Excellence (ACE) selected the City of Tallassee as part of its 2017 Incoming Class.
- Prior to being selected for the program, Tallassee had not had a comprehensive plan update in over 35 years.
- This partnership resulted in the City receiving a \$60,000 rural business development grant (RBDG) from USDA to complete the update.









The Process...



• Using information gathered from ACE community assessments; comprehensive plan element meetings; and input provided by local leadership, CARPDC composed *Tallassee 2040 Comprehensive Plan.*


Randy Meador Lifetime Achievement Award




